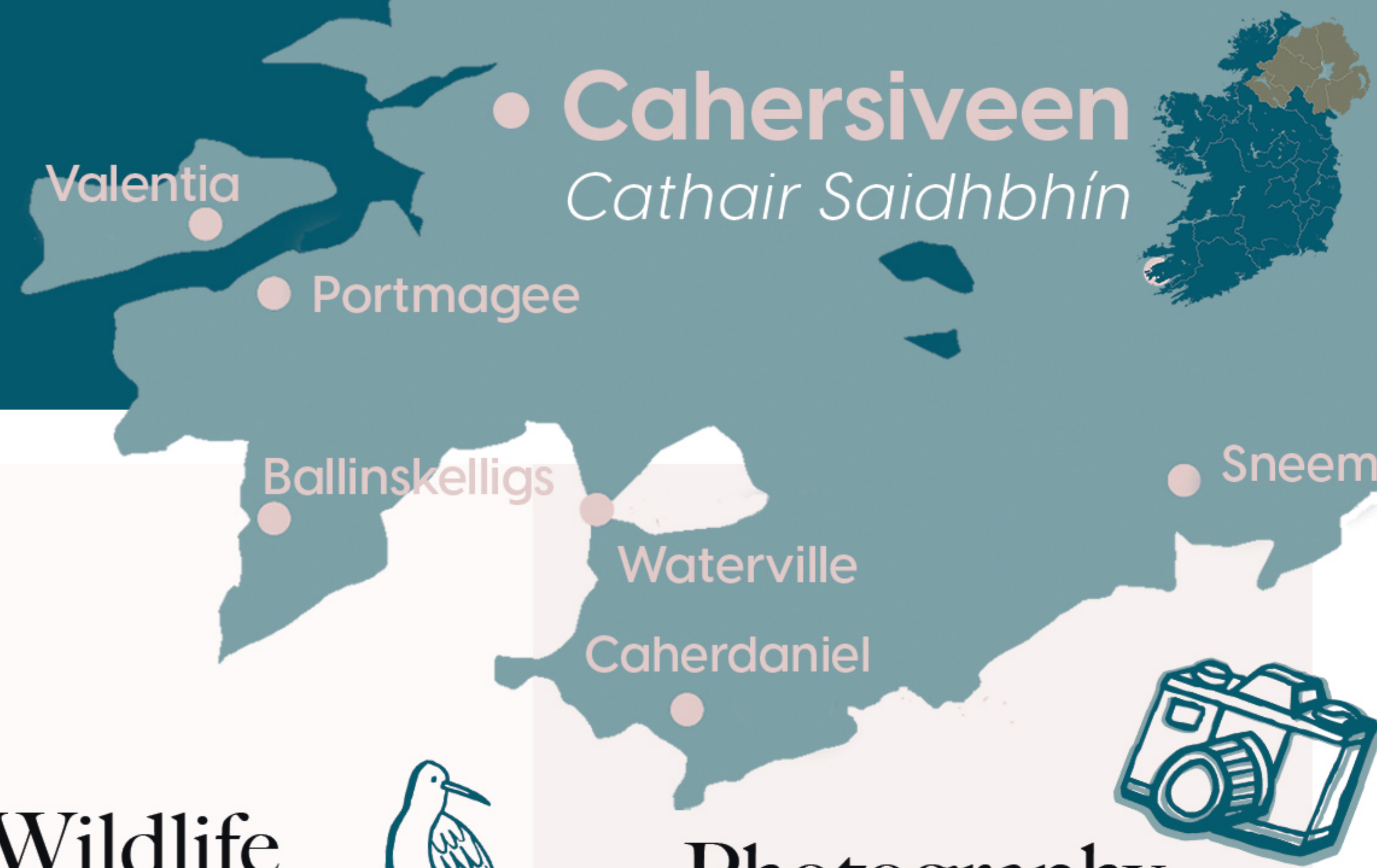




DISCOVER Cahersiveen

Culture

Local Business

Cahersiveen has plenty of shops and cafés to explore and a number of the pubs have great food and regular live music and trad sessions.

Ring Forts

The stone ringforts of Cahergall & Leacanabuaille are 3.5km east of Cahersiveen, in an area known locally as 'Over The Water'.

Geology

While 'Over The Water', why not visit white strand and black strand to see evidence of Iveragh's dramatic geological past, including volcanic rocks.

Active

Hike

There are numerous local walking trails. Follow the Beentee Loop from the Fair Green to experience sweeping views across Iveragh, native woodland, peatland and farmland.

Water

Between the Ferth Estuary and the Portmagee Channel, Cahersiveen has options for water activities including kayaking and boat trips. Why not take a dip at Cuas Crome or one of the other sheltered coves or sandy beaches nearby.

Bike

If cycling is your style then why not rent a bike and take the bridge 'Over The Water' or, if the seasonal ferry is running, pop over to Valentia Island.

Family

History

Work on the iconic riverside Cahersiveen Barracks began in 1870. A walk through the adjacent park brings you to a replica stone fort & has great views of the old railway bridge.

Views

Top of the Rock is a scenic viewpoint located 3.5km east of Cahersiveen. Fairy doors lead the way along a short walk where signage helps identify the landmarks in the area.

Playgrounds

The playground in Cahersiveen is located in the Fair Green. There is an adjacent green with trees & benches – maybe even some coffee nearby for the grown-ups.

Wildlife

Woodland

Carhan Wood is a rare patch of native woodland on Iveragh. Rich autumn colours will take your breath away and make sure to start early for the dawn chorus in spring.

Birdwatching

The Fertha River estuary is at the east end of town & while birds can be seen year-round, September to April is when overwintering waders call this area home.

Water

The Daniel O'Connell Memorial Park, just outside Cahersiveen is a beautiful place to sit on the riverbank and watch for wildlife. For something more marine, take a stroll towards the rocky strand near Mannix Point and see if you can spot a seal.

Morning Light

The woods in Carhan offer dappled light to highlight spring flowers while the early morning sun creeps up along the dramatic slopes of Cnoc na dTobar.

Townscape

Maybe it's people or maybe it's buildings, the town has options to express your creative skills including murals, churches, baked goods & of course tasting the local brews

Sunset

The marina, Reenard Point, or Over The Water are ideal places to wait for the changing light & reflections on the water. Ring forts & Ballycarbery Castle make for iconic silhouettes at sunset or after dark.
